


Work on the wall is not preventing Church services from taking place and there are three this month – on the 9^{th} , 23^{rd} and 30^{th} .

- Sunday 23rd January 9.30 am Family Communion
- Sunday 30th January 9.30 am Christingle (Benefice Service)

January 2022 has five Sundays and the 5th Sunday is marked in our 3 churches (Chapel Chorlton, Maer and Whitmore) by holding a Benefice Service – one service for all 3 parishes. Sunday 30th is Maer's turn and we are holding a <u>Christingle</u>, an old Moravian custom celebrating Jesus Christ as the Light of the world.

An orange, representing the world, has a candle, representing the light of Christ, put in the top, and is decorated with red ribbon and sweets. Many churches have a Christingle at Christmas; our tradition has been to hold one on the Sunday closest to Candlemas, February 2nd, another festival of light (and also Groundhog Day) If you've never been to a Christingle, come and join us at Maer on 30th January.



The reconstruction of the church wall has finally started (nearly two years on) and this has led to the road being closed for several weeks. Whist this is great that this is happening, the diversion when they are working is miserable especially for folk going to work and school. But at least it is open at the weekend. Thanks to Elena for the informative letter and liaising with the construction company.
